

TIE-BREAKER RULES

For two-way ties: Apply the Head-to-Head rule – the team that beat the other is declared the winner.

For three-way ties: Apply the following rules in the order presented until the tie is broken. If one tied team can be eliminated from the three-way tie, but the other two teams remain tied, apply the Head-to-Head rule described above to settle that tie.

1. Least points allowed
 - a. For each tied team, add up the points scored by its two TIED opponents.
 - b. The team with the lowest total points is declared 1st position, 2nd position goes to the team with the next lowest total points and 3rd position goes to the team with the greatest total points.
 - c. If the three-way tie continues, proceed to step 2.
2. Fewest player personal fouls
 - a. For each tied team, count the number of personal fouls committed by each team in ALL games played.
 - b. The team that committed the fewest personal fouls is declared 1st position, 2nd position goes to the team with the next lowest number of total fouls and 3rd position goes to the team with the greatest number of total fouls.
 - c. If the three-way tie continues, proceed to step 3.
3. Most free throws made
 - a. For each tied team, count the number of free throws made in ALL games played.
 - b. The team with the greatest number of free throws made is declared 1st position, 2nd position goes to the team with the next highest number of free throws made and 3rd position goes to the team with the least number of free throws made.
 - c. If the three-way tie continues, proceed to step 4.
4. Coin flip
 - a. The division commissioner will flip a coin designating either “heads” or “tails” for each tied team.
 - b. The odd team will be declared 1st position. The remaining tied teams will be settled using the Head-to-Head rule.
